

2020 Silent Auction

Our annual gala usually happens in January, however in the planning for the 2020 gala, we decided to have it in April. This shift was made in hopes to capitalize on slightly warmer weather here in Rochester to match a more springtime theme for our 5th year celebration. As you know, COVID-19 has impacted the world and we now live in different times than we did even just a few months ago. We would have loved to have our annual gala but with the news

coming out early March, we made the difficult decision to cancel this year's gala for the safety of our community.

Our annual gala is our largest annual fundraiser, bringing in almost 20% of our donations. With that large of an impact we didn't want to lose a chance to bring in more money for our dogs at the same time we wanted to keep the connections we had with our generous sponsors. We pivoted the gala into an online auction. We are grateful for all of our sponsors who wanted us to keep what they have given at that point in time and how each of them contributed to our online auction's success. We were

able to raise over \$3,000 from this auction, while still only a portion of what we normally would raise from gala, these funds are essential to continuing our mission to help the dogs in our community.



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Rochester Pride Parade

Annually, we look forward to marching with our volunteers in Rochester's Pride Parade. This year will be different due to COVID-19, as many parts of our lives currently are. While we cannot formally get together to march, we can and do show our support and pride on social media.

This year we set up a Bonfire campaign to show-case our pride inspired logo on a variety of shirts, tank tops, and sweatshirts. While planning, we needed to ensure this campaign has our LGBTIQA+community in mind. We began looking at several options of organizations and in the end we chose to split our proceeds from this campaign with the MOCHA Center, a part of Trillium Health here in Rochester. They specialize in sexual health for LGBT People of Color, specifically youth. We are proud to have raised the money we have, and will be making a donation to their organization in the amount of \$615.00.

Sadly, this is the second large-scale fundraising event we have had to cancel this year due to COVID-19. This was going to be our 2nd annual Barkin at the Blue Barn event scheduled for Sunday August 9th 2020. Even with our preparations following the guidelines from the CDC and New York State, the gathering numbers would have been over the maximums allowed at this time. While passing up another fundraiser was a difficult decision, the decision to cancel was made with the safety of our volunteers and attendees in mind.

We look forward to hosting this next year with our wonderful partners at the Blue Barn Cidery, who helped us have our first successful event with them in 2019, raising over \$3,500. The success of that event last year made it possible for us to support 7 dogs in October, our Harry Potter named group that needed help. Our supporters often do not know that each dog we take in as a rescue has \$500 earmarked for them before joining us. This is to ensure that we can provide them with microchipping, vaccinations, spay or neuters, and other routine veterinary care.

rescue immediately goes into a warm and loving home. Our fosters are critical to the success of our dogs and our organization. We always are looking for new foster homes, so please consider opening your home, arms, and hearts to helping a dog.

The foster experience is mutually beneficial; but that is an overly simplistic way to say that you'll gain from opening your home.

Your Life

Another way you can support us and our dogs is to open your hope and life to adopting a dog. While saving that dog's life is an obvious benefit, adoption does so much more than saving one life. When you adopt, you open up the spot in the foster home that was being enjoyed by your new dog. This means the organization can now support another homeless dog from our community, instantly saving two lives. When you adopt a rescue, specifically a rescue pit dog, you are also showing others that these lovable, loyal, and beautiful dogs are worth saving. This support goes a long way in the exposure, education, and acceptance of bully type dogs in our community and around the country. Possibly saving countless more lives with just one home becoming a furever home.

As with fostering, you and your family will see how wonderful it is to bring a dog into your life. If the fostering bit above did not get you wondering about beginning the process, I hope this one does. If you would like to adopt from us please go to our website, rescuepit.org and fill out an application to adopt.

- After you submit your application, it will be sent onto our pets team who will review your application.
- After approval, someone from the team will reach out to you and ask about your availability for a home visit. Right now due to COVID-19, our home visits are happening on the video conferencing platform, Zoom. You'll receive information about connect ing as this process progresses.
- A home visit report will be written up by the facilitators of the visit and the rest of the team and the board will review.
- When a consensus of approval is reached, you will be informed of your approval to adopt from us.
